5. Discussion on Shipley Exchange planning proposal	

Introduction to the scheme from Jon, set in context of Crossley Evans site, Cardinal site, Shipley Exchange. Description of use of Beck as a landscape feature, access, visibility and sanctuary features. Not known who will own the Beck corridor. Proposing morphological changes in channel, opening out channel in some places. Problems foreseen: litter especially near supermarket. Loss of wildlife habitat will occur. No spawning habitat, needs gravels. CSOs need sorting out. Some members are not keen on any development of the site. Good things: grasslands and butterfly friendly bushes and trees. Fish easement on gauging weir. Introduce some morphological variety in channel, need flood risk assessment. Resolution of meeting: we agreed that there are benefits to the Beck in the designs being proposed. If the development goes ahead, we would request the following mitigation and improvements which would improve the Beck and local ecology: Barnev and Dave Mould Improvements to in-stream habitats through changes to velocity to continue profiles and bedforms, e.g. by introduction of boulders and groyne to liaise deflectors, and creating of gravel and wetland areas. with Improvements to fish passability at weirs and steps through developer notching or removal of steps and weirs, or creating on "easements" via Jon which enable fish to climb or jump the structures. Survey of all combined sewer and surface water outfalls and working with owners, Yorkshire Water, Bradford Council and Barney Environment Agency to ensure proper functioning of screens and authorised no unauthorised discharges of polluting materials (solids, to respond sediment, chemicals, microbiological species. to the Planting of native grasslands and nectar rich bushes and trees to planning support the existing butterfly populations. application Removal or lowering of the Beck's sidewalls wherever possible in these with sloping of banks, giving a more natural appearance and terms on increasing visibility and access. behalf of FOBB. 6.
