

Rob congratulated Barney on his recent MBE award, given for services to the environment in Bradford, on behalf of FOBB and all Bradfordians.	
Rob expressed gratitude for Barney's work and achievements with FOBB, and a temporary MBE medal was presented pending the official investiture later in the year.

2. Peter Kirton of the Environment Agency was awarded 'Best Friend of Bradford's Becks' for his huge commitment to investigating the pollution incidents on Bradford Beck and beyond. A plaque was given. Peter thanked the group and expressed his passion for preserving the health of Bradford's waterways. He is the first non-volunteer to have received this award.

- e. Rob mentioned recurrent sewage leaks on Hirst Lane, Shipley - not affecting watercourse, but public health hazard. Reported to Bradford Council and YW
- f. Rob reported that 1<sup>st</sup> solar monitoring equipment has arrived from Taiwan struggling to cope with UK climate! Flat battery. Liaising with suppliers.
- g. Kevin reported some Beck monitoring equipment has been stolen as it is valuable. Not vandalism.

## 4. Trout in the Town status. Rob

We now have Silver Level Accreditation of the 'Trout in the Town' scheme organised by the Wild Trout Trust – there are only 4 Silver Level areas in England. 'Trout in the Town' handbook was passed round the meeting. The 'Trout in the Town' logo below can now be used by FOBB.



John and Andy reported seeing trout in Middlebrook and Pitty Beck, respectively.

Trout in the Town are involved in the design of the Shipley daylighting project.

The contractor is costing up the proposal at present, we hope to see this at the next meeting, 11th Jan. c. The timetable continues to slip, we'll know more after 11<sup>th</sup> Jan. d. We (Rob and Barney) had a site meeting with EA, Council (Andrew Mindham) WTT (Paul Gaskell) on 14th Dec to discuss what enhancements to the project could be carried out with additional funding. The idea is to bid for some EA WEIF money. Lots of ideas to put in a menu style bid. e. Daylighting celebration. i. Date not yet decided as completion date of works not known.
